2014 Year End Summary Brief

In 2014, the department received 12,492 referrals, averaging 1,041 referrals per month, which involved 7,492 youth. A decline in referral activity was noted when compared to 2013 data (-9.4%). Decreases were found for sexual assault (-40.7%) other misdemeanor A/B offenses (-9.0) and both felony and misdemeanor A/B assault (-8.2% and -11.2% respectively). Although misdemeanor A/B thefts were down by 4.0%, felonies in this same category increased by 23.1%. Much like the previous year, evade/resisting arrest offenses descended by 3.1% in the A/B misdemeanor classification whereas felonies rose by 15.0%. Increases were also observed for arson (38.7%), along with misdemeanor A/B trespass (25.6%) and runaways (14.0%).

Felony referrals comprised 16.2% of the total referred, the largest increase in more than 10 years. Felony crimes against property grew by 21.2%, whereas felony crimes against persons fell by 103 offenses (-13.2%). For the fifth year in a row, the top 10 felonies and misdemeanor offenses both experienced a decrease over the previous year at -1.9% and -16.3% respectively. Notable in the top 10 felony category is the decline of aggravated sexual assaults of a child under 14 years of age at -47.4%, while unauthorized use of a motor vehicle experienced the largest ascent of 53.8%. Of the top 10 misdemeanor offenses, evading arrest plunged by 84.0% while possession of marijuana-less than 2 oz. climbed 22.6% from 474 in 2013 to 581 in 2014. There were 4 African-American and 4 Hispanic males charged with homicide in 2014, averaging 16 years of age. Of these 8 referrals for murder, there were 8 actual deaths.

Petitions filed and representative youth waned slightly from the previous year at -4.2% and -3.3% respectively. Court activity in 2014 displayed a small decrease in petitions disposed when compared to 2013 (-4.6%). In 2013, 11,200 cases were disposed, while in 2014, it was 10,682. The department experienced a sizeable reduction (-17.1%) of youth assigned to TJJD from 123 in 2013 down to 102 in 2014. Although certifications for youth shrank from 37 certifications in 2013 to 34 in 2014 (-8.1%), the petition total for these youth increased by 43.2%. Total youth assigned supervision declined 7.1% since 2013 while specialized supervision caseloads remained relatively steady with a monthly average of 994.

Youth placed in Harris County Juvenile post-adjudicated facilities fell by 23.0%, similar to the decrease shown in private placements (-23.9%). There was an increase of 8.0% in youth admitted to the Juvenile Justice Center's detention facility from 2,673 in 2013 up to 2,888 in 2014. This upswing of admissions contributed to the 4.9% jump in the average daily population of the detention facility to 213, an increase from 203 in 2013.






Charges Received as Compared to Youth Involved January-December 2012-2014




Delinquent Conduct Referrals

Murder Referrals



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


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

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

January - December 2014*



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

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



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The following table presents a comparison of *January-December 2013* referral activity as contrasted to *January-December 2014* referral activity. During this month, the data shows an overall 9.4% decrease in referral activity. Despite this decrease, increases are found for Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle (53.8%), Arson (38.70%), Misdemeanor A/B Trespass (25.6%), and Felony Theft (23.1%). Several decreases include Sexual Assault (-40.7%), Misdemeanor A/B Drugs (-11.9%), Misdemeanor A/B Assault (-11.2%), and Homicide (-11.1%). Less serious offenses decreased by 40.2%.

There were 8 referrals for homicide during January-December 2014, compared to 9 for the same time period of 2013.*

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
