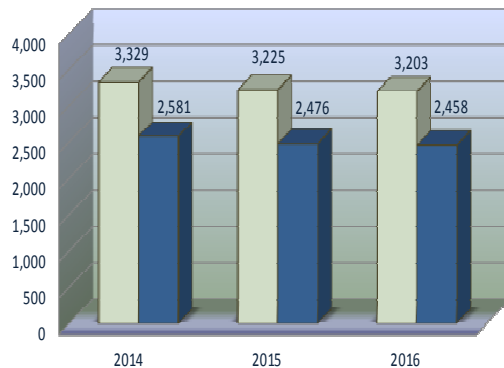

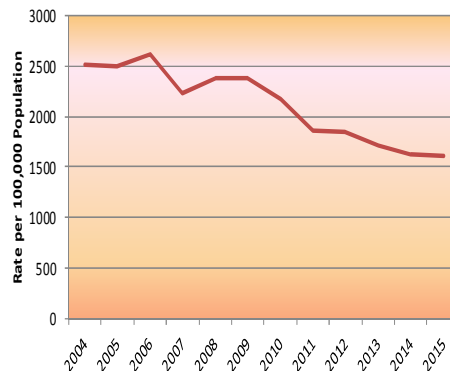

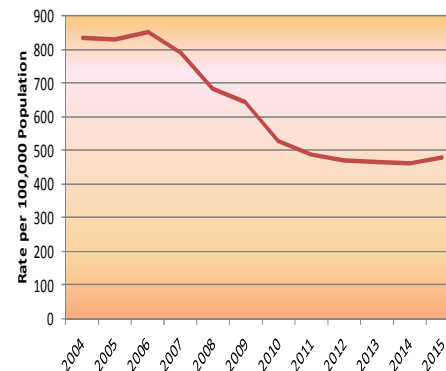
Charges Received as Compared to Youth Involved January-March 2014-2016



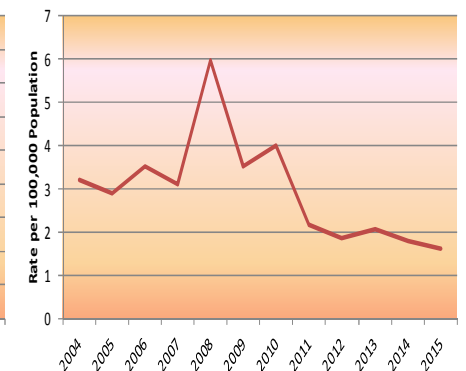
Delinquent Conduct Referrals

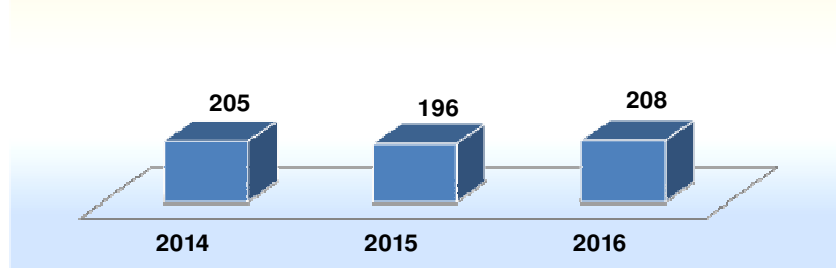

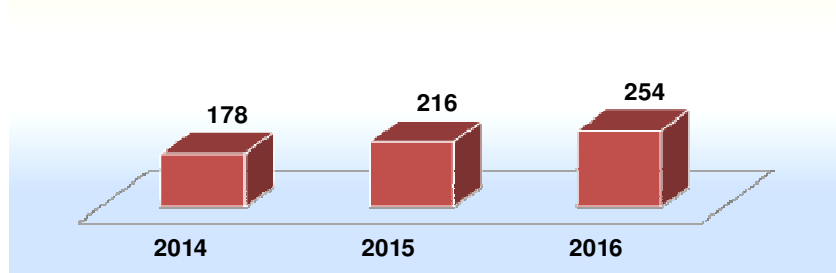

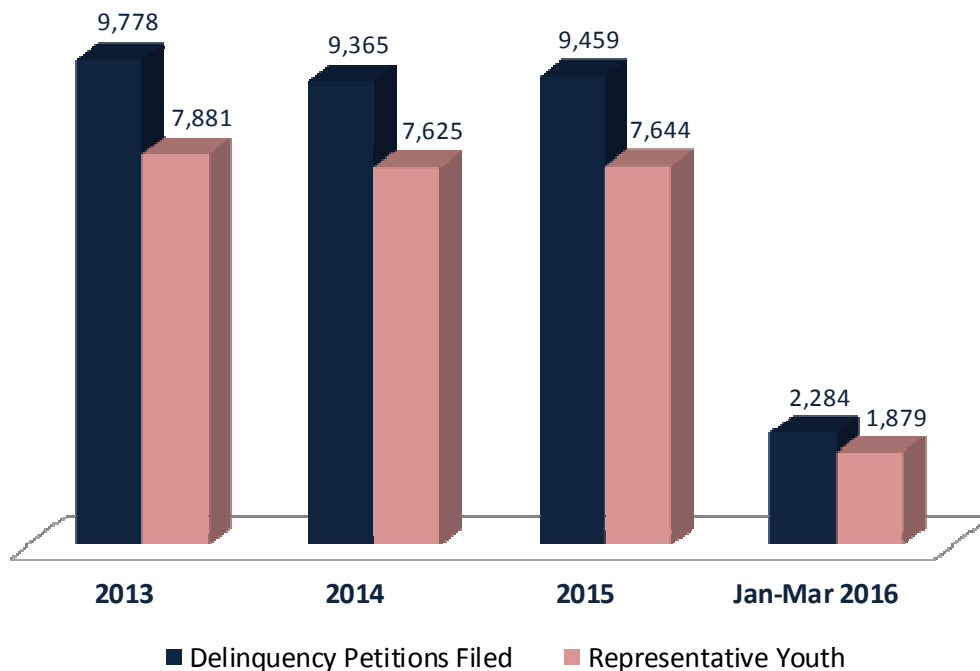

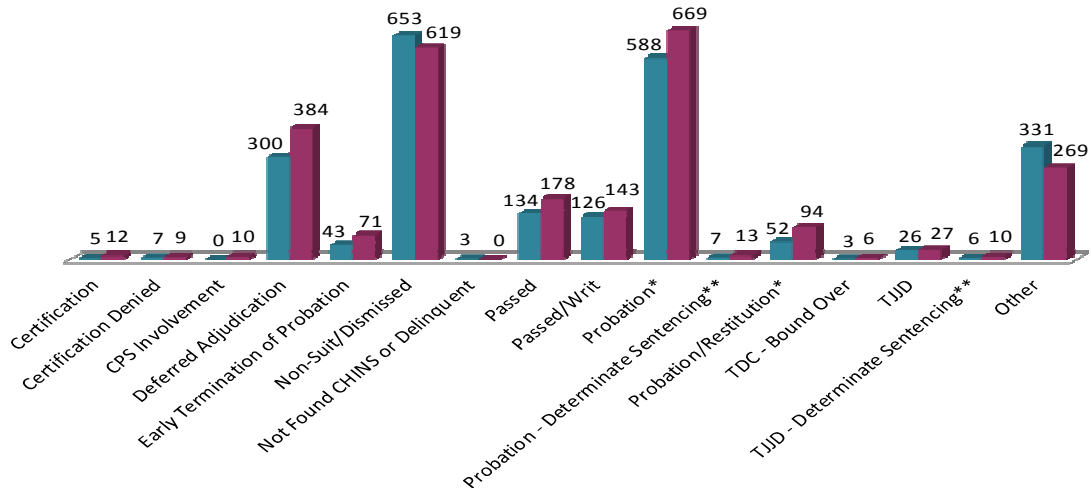

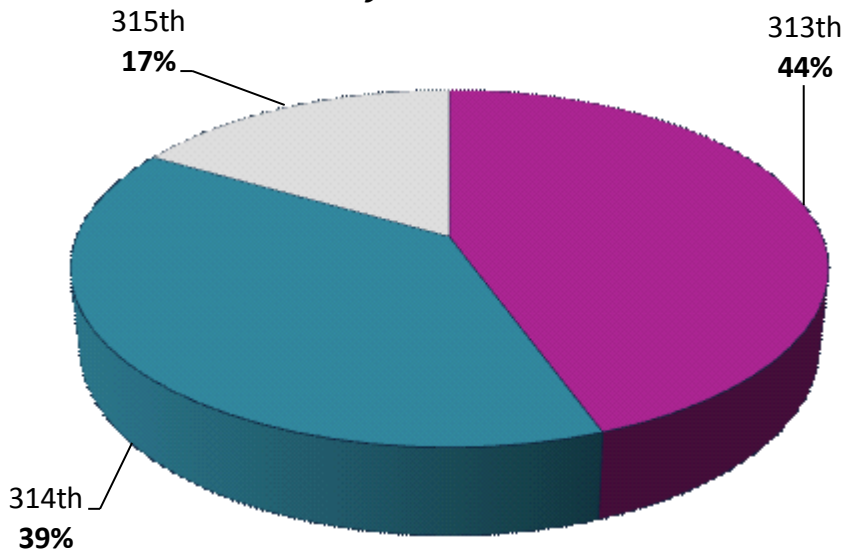

The following table presents a comparison of **January-March 2015** referral activity as contrasted to **January-March 2016** referral activity. During this month, the data shows an overall 0.7% decrease in referral activity. Despite this decrease, increases are found for Sexual Assault (290.9%), Felony Mischief (75.0%), Misdemeanor A/B Mischief (29.8%), and Felony Theft (21.6%). Several decreases include Homicide (-50.0%), Auto Theft (-45.5%), Arson (-40.0), and Misdemeanor A/B Theft (-24.7%). Less serious offenses decreased by 8.4%.

There was 1 referral* for homicide during January-March 2016, compared to 2 for the same time period of 2015.

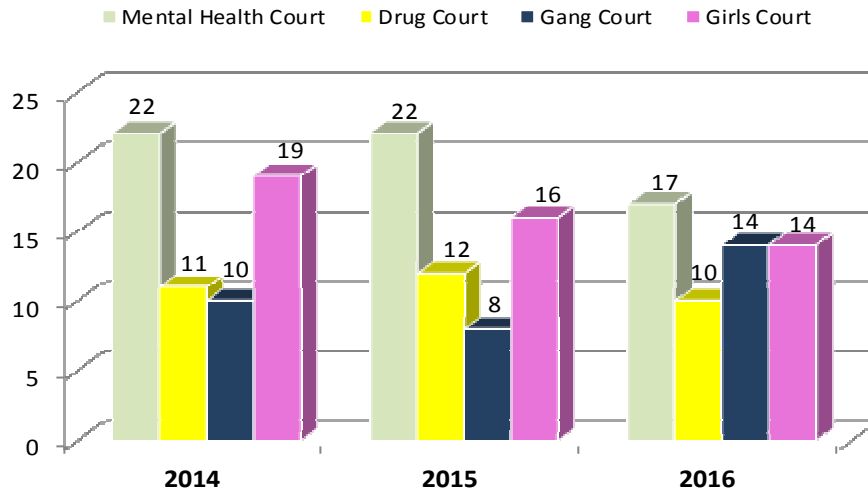
